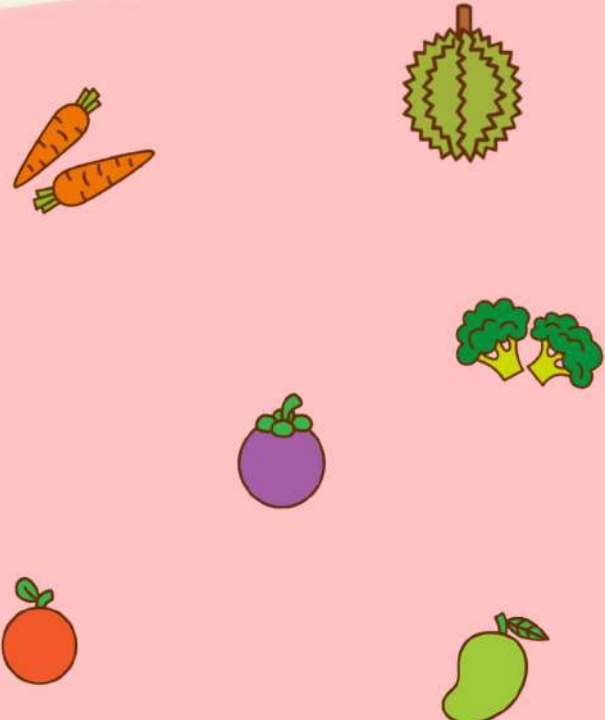
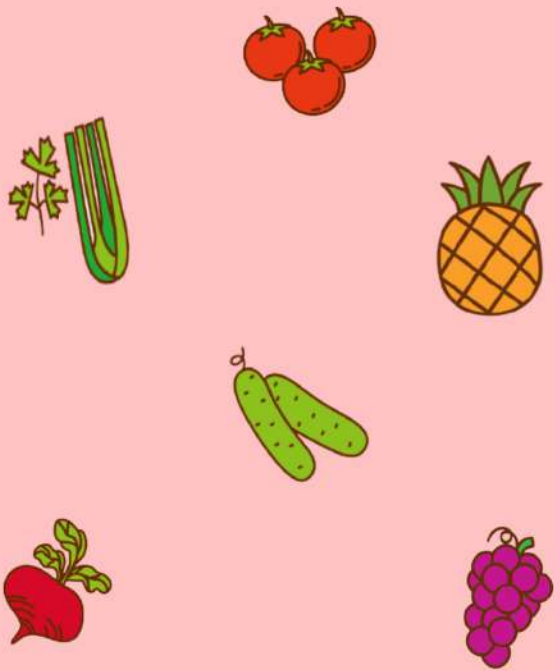


INTERACT HEARTS FOR HUNGER 2021

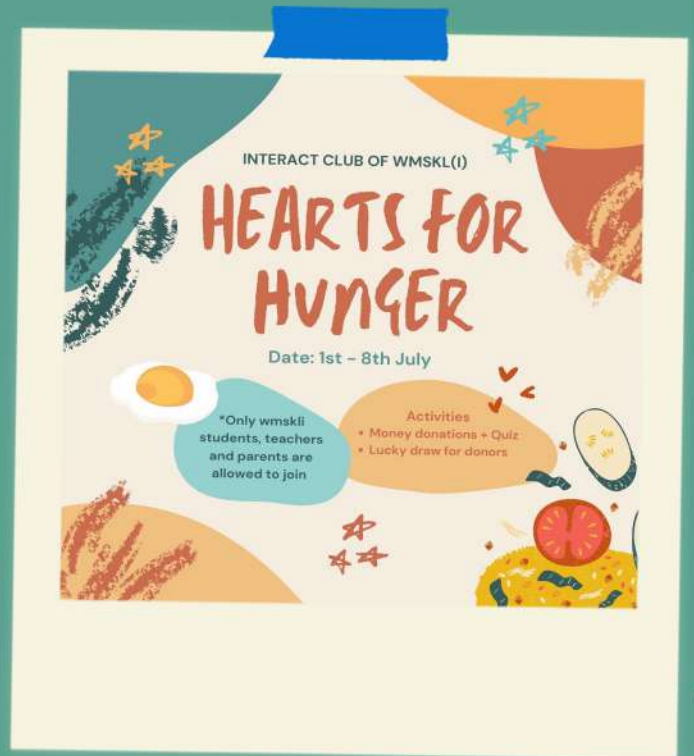

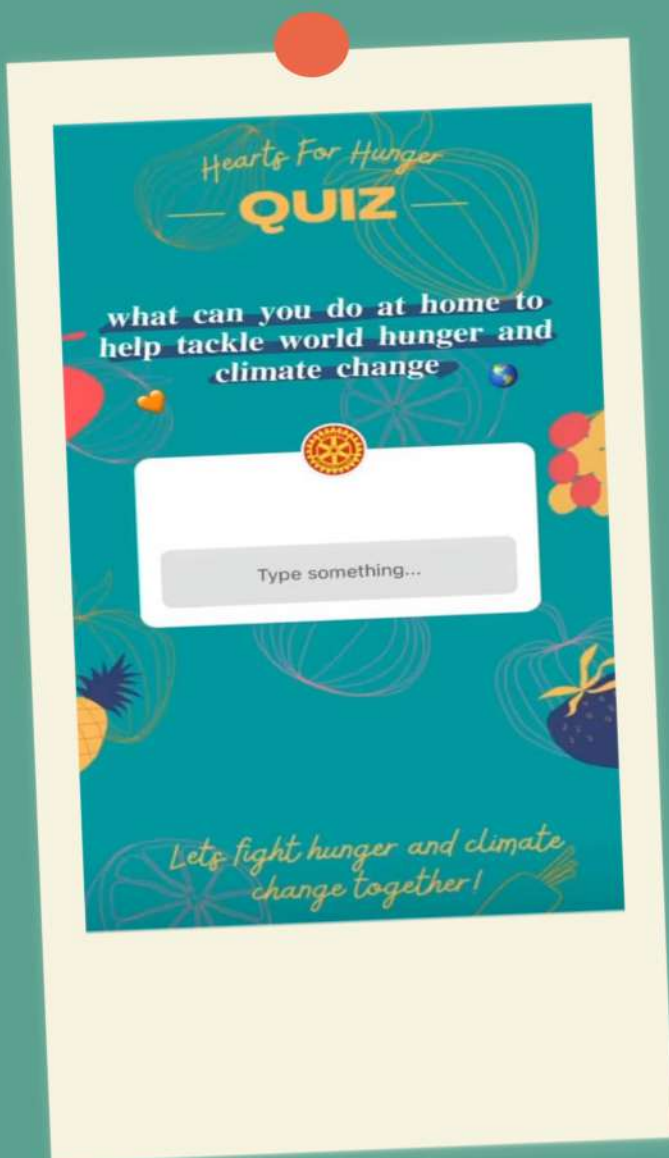

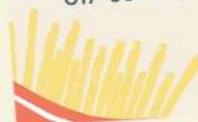
