Say as many sayings as you can think of in 40 seconds! You can use the form "I WISH YOU... " For the saying :)




Example: I wish you good fortune!

You can say it anyway you like but make sure it's a blessing :D


For the 'Bless'in Poems' activity, students had to write a poem and submit it via a Google form link given on Ms Teams. The requirements for the poems were the poems had to be related to the theme of blessings and the poems had to include specific words revealed each day at 8am on Ms Teams. Each day, one winner was selected from the participants of lower and upper secondary students respectively. Creative poems showering words of blessings really amazed the teacher advisors and the committee members.

The 'Speedy Blessings' activity was held via Zoom during the lower and upper secondary break and lunch. Students were given an option to play this game in either Mandarin or English. In their chosen language, students were given 40 seconds to say words of blessing like 新年快乐 (xin nian kuai le) or I wish you a prosperous year ahead. The wishes had to adhere to the daily themes set and these were only revealed right before the students began playing. Many students rose to the challenge and had lots of fun.

Winners from both the activities were contacted on 15 February and given prizes of GrabFood orders. In the span of 3 days, over 60 students actively participated in activities where they demonstrated conscious choices of lifting others up through their words, making this program a success.







On the 26 th of February, the Student Leaders Discipleship Care Group organized the Impact Camp,

themed 'Worship' online from 4.00 pm to 6.30 pm. There were 57 participants. The speakers were Ms Juwita Suwito, a singer-songwriter and vocal coach who also chairs the TRAC Board of Worship & Music; Mr Steve Leong who has been actively involved in music ministry and profession for the last 30 years and Mr Marcus Leong who has been serving in worship ministry and recently formed a funk bass – quitar duo named Iscus.

This special event began with an introduction by Ms Elise Lai and a group photo session. The event continuedwithavideopresentationentitled, 'Understanding Worship' by Mr. Rupert Ling followed by a relection time on 'What is Worship?' facilitated by Mdm. Audrey Ti. 
begins from the preparation of the posture of our hearts.


Prefects
